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I. PROJECT

1. Project objectives

The project's main objective was to disseminate good practices related to the mobility of students, and academic and administrative staff members, and to develop theses and assumptions to be followed to support international student mobility between universities.

Cooperation of the universities within the project aimed at widening and developing the knowledge, skills, and competencies of project participants, especially in the field of:

- increasing professional competencies,
- increasing their self-esteem and self-confidence,
- improving foreign language proficiency,
- developing key social competencies due to the cooperation in an international environment,
- increasing attractiveness in the workplace and labour market,
- improving teaching skills (teachers),
- enriching materials and educational aids.

Cooperation within the project is also aimed at:

- developing and realisation of the international strategy of participating universities,
- increasing of education level and quality,
- comparing and improving educational curricula, and in the case of Partner Universities,
- adjusting educational programmes to European standards – Benchmarking,
- working on common educational programmes for master's students,
- preparing of programmes for double diplomas with Partner Universities,
- developing and exchange of cooperation proposals in the field of research activities that can result in international scientific projects and joint scientific publications.

Exchange of experience and good practices contributed to developing and disseminating ideas about studying abroad, indicating sources of funding for international academic exchange, representing good practices developed in the Universities.

Problems related to social, legal, and environmental barriers and ways of their solution have also been discussed.

Cooperation between the Universities definitely contributed to the increase of their prestige in regional and local educational markets.

All objectives of the project have been achieved!

2. Participating universities

a. Poland

- **Wyższa Szkoła Ekologii i Zarządzania w Warszawie**
(University of Ecology and Management in Warsaw)



University of Ecology and Management in Warsaw (UEM) is one of the best private technical – artistic universities in Poland. UEM, established upon the decision of the Ministry of National Education on 18 July 1995 and registered under number 62, more than 27 years conducts education in full-time and part-time bachelor's and master's studies.

Education at the University is conducted within two Faculties: the Faculty of Architecture and the Faculty of Engineering and Management, in which it is possible to study 11 fields of studies.

The mission of the University of Ecology and Management in Warsaw is high-quality, modern and flexible education of studies:

- ready to meet the developmental needs of information society and the knowledge-based economy,
- enriching with their professionalism and intellectual mobility human capital of Masovia, Poland, and the EU,
- creating new economic, social, and cultural values in the spirit of the idea of sustainable development, according to expectations of the current and future labor market.

University authorities pay attention to the high level of education by hiring more than 300 specialists from different fields. Lecturers of UEM are not only scientific workers of other universities in Warsaw but also practitioners possessing business experience. Due to the combination of knowledge of lecturers and representatives of Faculty Councils of Employers, with whom programmes of studies are being discussed (according to European standards), studies in UEM are interdisciplinary, combine theory with practices, due to which are conducted with the application of design approach, teach students independence and ability to take responsible decisions.

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b. Armenia

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(National University of Architecture and Construction of Armenia)



The National University of Architecture and Construction of Armenia (NUACA) is a higher school of Architecture and Construction that was founded in Yerevan in 1921. It is a technical school that has been in operation for nearly 100 years. The university consists of five faculties: Architecture, Design, Construction, Urban Economy and Ecology, and Management and Technology. Moreover, NUACA is the only university in Armenia preparing architects and construction engineers.

The internationalisation strategy of NUACA testifies its strong commitment to the promotion of sustainable development of international relations for educational, scientific, and technical cooperation. The strategy also includes actions to develop cooperation with architectural and construction-oriented universities abroad, intending to organise joint conferences, student project weeks, contests, and the promotion of academic mobility of teaching staff and students.

NUACA has participated in 17 TEMPUS, Erasmus Mundus, and currently Erasmus+ projects. Three Erasmus+ KA2 projects are ongoing: HERITAG, InnoCENS, and Iacobus+. As well as two KA1 projects with Universidade de Lisboa and the University of Alcalá are currently active. NUACA has accomplished some EU-funded mobility projects: the Erasmus Mundus Infinity project and Erasmus+ KA1 with the Polytechnic University of Milan.

Besides, NUACA is actively implementing student exchange projects in the framework of Cooperation Agreements signed with European partner Higher Educational Institutions from Poland, Spain, Udine, etc.

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c. Azerbaijan

- **Azərbaycan Texnologiya Universiteti**
(Azerbaijan Technological University)



Azerbaijan Technological University was founded on the initiative of national leader Heydar Aliyev in 1970 in Ganja. The university provides education on one campus consisting of 6 educational and 1 administrative buildings. Besides, for the incoming students, there is a dormitory that can host international students in the city. The university offers 24 bachelor's, 23 master's, and 11 doctoral degree programmes and serves 3500 students with a teaching and research staff of 550.

UTECA's main educational fields are IT and Computer Science, Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Material Science and Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Textile Engineering, Food Sciences and Technology, Tourism Technologies, Machine-Building, Business Administration, Industrial Management, Public Administration, Management and Training-Education Technologies of Human Resources.

The University aims to provide physically and mentally strong progressive candidates who will stimulate the development of technologies in all strategic spheres of Azerbaijan. After the independence, the importance of the University to the country further increased. So, establishing several production enterprises in different areas of industry, as well as reconstruction of mining industries and rapid development of information communication technologies and such kind of directions make it necessary to bring new modern technical equipment to the country for the development of the non-oil sector.

Besides, Azerbaijan Technological University works on transforming education into a Technopark type higher education institution. In 2013 Azerbaijan Technological University changed its working approach by starting of Customer Orientation Programme, which shifts education quality and makes education in accordance with the requirements of customers. This situation makes ATU more attractive and each year number of students increases rapidly.

Internationalization is one of the major elements for the future development of Azerbaijan Technological University. UTECA participates in mobility programmes of Erasmus+ and cooperates with various universities in different countries. UTECA has enough experience and staff capacity to participate in international projects and deliver its values to the global markets.

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d. China

(Shandong Jianzhu University)



The Shandong Jianzhu University (SJU), which was jointly established by Shandong Province and the Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development, was found in 1956. The University currently has more than 27,00 full-time students (including more than 200 international students). SJU is located in Shandong Province, the birthplace of Confucian culture. Shandong is an important province in terms of culture and economy on the east coast of China.

The SJU has become a well-known university with a long history, profound cultural heritage, strong academic strength, and extensive international influence. It is an ideal institution for students at home and abroad to pursue further studies.

The campus covers a land area of more than 160 hectares, with a building area of more than 660,000 square meters. The university includes 20 schools and 4 institutes. It provides 58 undergraduate programmes, 1 postdoctoral programme, 1 Ph.D. programme, 17 first-level master's programmes, 62 second-level master's programmes, and 9 professional master's programmes.

The university is also one of the first authorised universities that are eligible to recruit international students in China. The university attaches profound importance to international exchanges and cooperation. With an open mind, the university has established partnerships with more than 80 universities from over 30 countries and regions, including Australia, the USA, New Zealand, the UK, Canada, and so on. Currently, eight undergraduate joint programmes and more than 20 student exchange programmes have been established.

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e. Kosovo

- **Universiteti i Shkencave Aplikuarë në Ferizaj**
(University of Applied Sciences in Ferizaj)



The University of Applied Sciences in Ferizaj (UASF) was established by the Ministry of Education, Science, and Technology (MEST) on July 6, 2015, and was ratified by the Parliament of the Republic of Kosovo on July 16, 2015. The tradition of academic and scientific work in Ferizaj dates back to 1976 when the Assembly of Kosovo established the Centre for Higher Education. The Centre had a Machinery and Wood Industry Section, as well as a Workers' Section.

In the 1988 academic year, the Centre for Higher Education was abolished and the Technical High School was established, with the Machinery and Wood Industry Section, while the Workers' Section was completely abolished.

In the academic year 2002/03, new curricula were approved according to the Bologna system for basic studies (Bachelor), for the Department of Machinery with the profile: Artificial Materials Processing Technique and the Department of Wood Industry with the profile: Wood Processing.

With the decision of the Steering Council of the University of Prishtina, on 05.09.2005, Technical High School is transformed into the Faculty of Applied Technical Sciences (FATS), with the same Departments and profiles, while later at the Faculty of Applied Sciences (FAS), by enabling the Faculty to develop programmes beyond technical ones.

UASF organizes teaching in five faculties (basic studies and masters):

- Faculty of Architecture, Design, and Wood Technology:
 - Interior Architecture and Furniture Design;
 - Design and Construction of Wood products;
 - Green Architecture and Interior Design (Master).

These programmes offer studies in interior architecture, interior design, and the construction of wooden products.

- Faculty of Tourism and Environment:
 - Tourism and Hospitality Management;
 - Tourism and Innovation (Master).

This programme offers students the highest international standards in education, in the field of management in tourism and hospitality.

– Faculty of Industrial Engineering and Informatics:

- Industrial Engineering with Informatics;
- Applied Informatics (Bachelor);
- Engineering and Informatics (Master).

This programme offers studies that promote the strengthening of relations with industry and enables students in the fields of engineering, especially in the field of Industrial Engineering with Informatics.

– Faculty of Management:

- Industrial Management.

Industrial Management offers students the construction of new competencies by combining scientific and technological knowledge of management in industry, knowledge of communication, and creative work.

– Faculty of Applied Arts:

- Graphic Design and Multimedia.

The Graphic Design and Multimedia Programme was designed based on the labour market's demands and the Industrial Board's requirements, which operates within the University. Based on these requirements the programme will qualify professional staff with skills in graphic design services, who can use modern technology.

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f. Ukraine

- **Сумський державний університет**
(Sumy State University)



Sumy State University (SumDU) is a comprehensive higher education institution located in the city of Sumy, North-Eastern part of Ukraine. University follows the ideology of research, educational, and socially oriented institution where large-scale international cooperation and the focus on innovative technologies, in particular ICT, are prioritized. Educational and research activity of SumDU is comprehensive and embraces a wide scope of areas from engineering and ICT to natural sciences, medicine, and humanities.

The University currently serves about 12,000 students who are pursuing bachelor's, master's, and Ph.D. degrees in 57 majors and 25 fields of knowledge. Currently, more than 2000 foreign students at SumDU represent 53 countries worldwide. More than 20 study programmes are entirely taught in English.

SumDU is highly ranked at the national level, enters the TOP-group (3%) of leading universities of the world, and is classified as a university with high research intensity according to the QS World University Rankings and is included in THE World University Rankings by Times Higher Education.

SumDU is a signatory of Magna Charta Universitatum and a reliable member of the most authoritative international organizations - the International Association of Universities and European University Association.

Sumy State University cooperates with more than 300 partners from 58 countries. SumDU has proved to be a reliable partner for joint projects in frames of international programmes in particular funded by the European Commission. Every year it implements 300 grants. Over the last 5 years, the volume of research work in the framework of international grant projects has increased 20 times.

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- **Національний університет біоресурсів і природокористування України**
(National University of Life and Environmental Sciences of Ukraine)



The National University of Life and Environmental Sciences of Ukraine is one of the leading institutions of education, science, and culture in Ukraine. More than 26 thousand students and more than 600 graduates, Ph.D. students, and seekers study at 3 educational and research institutes and 13 departments of basic university institutions (in Kyiv) and 10 separate units of NULES of Ukraine – regional universities of I-III accreditation levels. Educational process and scientific research at the University are provided by more than 2,600 scientific and educational and pedagogical workers, including about 300 professors and doctors of sciences, more than 1,000 assistant professors, and PhDs.

The National University of Life and Environmental Sciences of Ukraine strengthens its leadership positions in the field of international activity from year to year. NULES of Ukraine participates actively in international programmes of higher education and helps foreign countries to prepare their national staff for agriculture.

Study at the National University of Life and Environmental science of Ukraine is based on international agreements of Ukraine, national programmes, treaties with legal entities, and individuals. Nowadays citizens of Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Iraq, Iran, Kazakhstan, Cyprus, Lebanon, Morocco, Palestine, Poland, Russia, Slovakia, USA, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, and the Czech Republic study at NULES of Ukraine. Close cooperation with leading universities around the world contributed to the reform and adaptation of the education system of NULES of Ukraine to the requirements of leading universities.

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- **Київський політехнічний інститут імені Ігоря Сикорського**

(National Technical University of Ukraine “Igor Sikorsky Kyiv Polytechnic Institute”)



Igor Sikorsky Kyiv Polytechnic Institute (KPI) was established in 1898. It is one of the biggest educational establishments in Europe. It has 16 faculties, 11 educational and scientific institutes, several scientific and research institutes, and educational centers. It cooperates with technical universities of dozens of world countries, a lot of international organizations (UNESCO, UNIDO, WIPO, NATO, EDNES, ICSU, CODATA, etc.), and the leading corporations and firms (SIEMENS, FESTO, SAMSUNG, INTEL, etc.), participates in international educational, scientific projects and programmes. New developments of KPI are annually awarded the State prize of Ukraine in the field of science and technology with different international awards.

At the end of September 2021, the International Higher Education Analytical Agency QS Quacquarelli Symonds published the Graduate Employability Rankings 2022. Igor Sikorsky Kyiv Polytechnic Institute took 301+ place by the integrated parameter Employer Reputation; in Alumni Outcomes - 301+ place; an Employer - Student Connections - 201+ place; in Partnerships with Employers - 201+ place; according to Graduate Employment Rate - 201+ place. The abovementioned facts as many others promote our University as one of the leading technical universities in Ukraine.

The University has a huge base of international contacts and actively participates in different international programmes. For now, it holds one of the leading positions in the ratings of Ukrainian universities with the biggest number of academic mobility participants in the EU programme “Erasmus+”. The University has more than 70 credit mobility projects with partner universities.

The strengthening of the international positions of KPI is included in its internationalization strategy. The implementation and realization of mobility programmes, regulated by bilateral agreements such as double programmes for Master's and Ph.D. levels as well as other students and staff academic mobility projects play a major role in the University's international activities.

The University's mission is to assist in the formation of the society's future on principles of the conception of sustainable development through internationalization and integration of education, the newest scientific research, and innovative developments. To create conditions for all-around professional, intellectual, social, and creative development of personality on the greatest levels of

perfection in an educationally scientific environment. In the field of international relations, Igor Sikorsky Kyiv Polytechnic Institute is deepening the internationalization of the university, strengthening the international component of its activity, directing research and educational technologies (including technologies of dual education) in order to prepare competent professionals to work in the global markets of education, science, and innovations, as well as to continue University transformation according to the model of research university of leadership-type by internationally recognized criteria.

International activities of the University envisage the following including but not limited to 1) unification of the potential and resources of the university for the development of international activity; 2) implementation of an active information policy in the sphere of international activities to promote university abroad; 3) improvement, the conditions for the development of the international activities of the university and the implementation of joint educational projects; 4) optimization of the interuniversity system of coordination, monitoring and development of the foreign economic activity.

Two administrative staff members of UEM took part in training or job shadowing organised by Partner Universities – 1 in the Azerbaijan Technological University, and 1 in the University of Applied Sciences in Ferizaj.

It is also worth mentioning that on 04 – 08 July 2022 the University of Ecology and Management in Warsaw organised Staff Week for representatives from Partner Universities, which was devoted to the issues concerning forms of cooperation with the socio-economic environment, international marketing and cooperation, education systems in Poland and Partner Countries, education quality assurance systems and tools, organisational, administrative and teaching challenges during the pandemic and plans related to the development of distance learning, possibilities of educational and research cooperation between Partner Universities, plans concerning further cooperation within Erasmus+ Programme and learning basics of the Polish language. During Staff Week representatives of Partner Universities shared good practices and discussed main problems during realisation of projects.

This event has strongly contributed to:

- development and realisation of the internationalisation strategy of Partner Universities;
- learning the structure, organisational culture, and way of operating of the Partner Universities;
- exchange of experiences related to structures, mechanisms, and improving the quality of education and quality assurance tools;
- improving the quality of education and services provided for students;
- improving procedures and support mechanisms for the international exchange of students, staff, and teachers between Universities;
- developing and exchanging ideas for cooperation within research and development activities;
- facilitating further integration of the Universities from Partner Countries with the European Higher Education Area;
- exchange of good practices connected with breaking social, legal, and environmental barriers of cooperation;
- promoting intercultural communication and a better understanding of European values.

From 22-26 of November 2021, I participated in the ERASMUS + KA107 Teaching Mobility programme at WSEIZ University (Warsaw, Poland).
